"As a mother of boys, I recently read the book 'Raising Boys' by Steve Biddulph. He emphasises the importance for boys to have mentors outside of the family unit, to help steer them. Traditional cultures have coming of age rituals where the men in the society mentor and guide the boys, preparing them for the important transition into manhood. Now however, mentoring is mostly unplanned and ad hoc. He writes "Those doing the mentoring - sports coaches, uncles, teachers and bosses - rarely understand their role and may do it badly". Research shows that men and boys are less likely to seek help for mental health issues due to cultural expectations that stigmatise emotional expression. When the cast were challenged to write a list poem about the 'rules of masculinity' it became apparent that there were still a lot of rules that stigmatise vulnerability." **Natasha Gilmore, Choreographer and Director**
